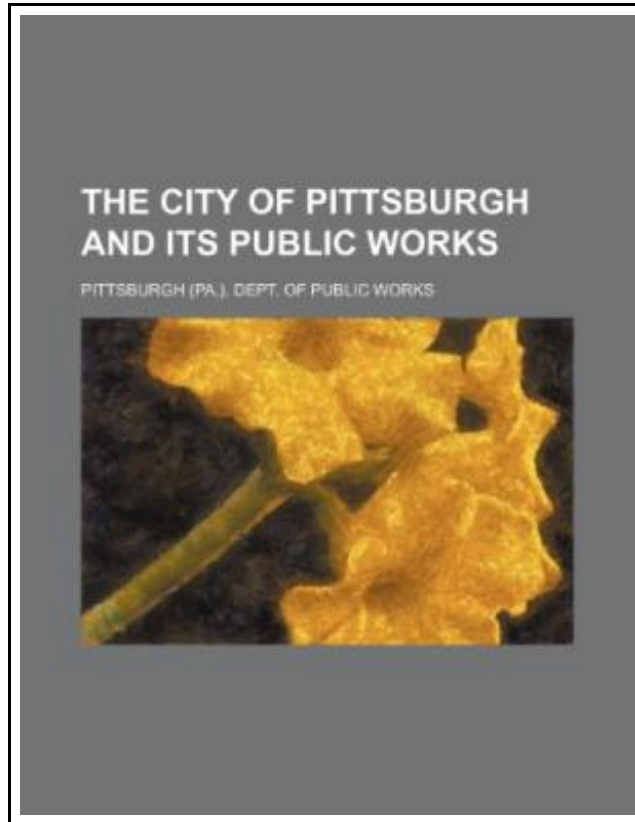

Not illustrated. 1916 Excerpt: . . . Ross Street to the 10th Street Bridge was carried out in conjunction with the abolishment of the grade crossing, which will be described elsewhere. The street was reimproved, and widened for a considerable distance, in 1914, at a cost of 135, 000. New Thoroughfares. The construction of new thoroughfares in various sections of the city was urgently required in order to relieve congestion of traffic on existing streets and to afford shorter and better intercommunication between various districts. This was accomplished by the grading, paving and curbing of new streets, by opening new traffic arteries, by utilizing streets which have in some cases been widened and extended, and by constructing bridges. One of the chief improvements of this nature was the opening up of the Baum Boulevard, Center Avenue, a parallel street, having been congested with traffic from the Grant Boulevard. This provided a new traffic route extending from Craig Street to Highland Avenue. In the development of this thoroughfare, for a considerable distance an existing street was utilized, part of which was widened, two concrete bridges were built over the Pennsylvania and the Pittsburgh Junction Railroads and about one-half mile of new street was opened. The entire cost of this improvement was 280, 000. 00, covering the cost of the two bridges, amounting to 188, 000 and damages amounting to 52, 000. 00. The Bloomfield Bridge and approaches, completed in 1914, extending from the Grant Boulevard to Liberty Avenue, form a connecting link...
