

Outstanding Features The outstanding features of the Springfield Survey are, it seems to the reviewer, (1) the prompt publication of the reports of each section in separate, handy form, and (2) the policy of concurrent and follow-up publicity. By contrast with the tardy and ineffective use of the material in many other investigations, these policies indicate a real achievement. The plan of separate handbooks on each topic makes the facts more accessible to special...
